women and children.




1) Timely helps such as food, health/hygiene, relief aide, and other outreaches serve your community.

For example, we were featured in Times of Zambia for feeding 685 families during the pandemic.

2) Professional development trainings empower Zambian leaders in a variety of topics.

For example, with the approval of the Ministry of Health, we have trained over 40 organizations in our evidence-based, Zambia-specific drug and alcohol curriculum - "Literacy-Free 12 Step Expressive Arts Therapy" .

3) Programs and program materials in various areas and topics uplift women and children.

For example, our education curriculum in math, science, literacy, and the bible can be utilized by any organization we assist.

For example, we have a child sponsorship program to help rural students be able to attend school.

4) Skilled interns serve in their professional or academic area, meeting a wide variety of local needs of organisations we assist. Our internships can be credit-bearing and are both Zambian and international.

Service length is for 2 weeks, 1 month, or 1 semester.



Internships are to be considered to be one part mentoring from local leaders and one part skilled service in their field of study.

Zambians may also apply to serve abroad through CoLaborers International's internship program.
